Suitably experienced and qualified Contractors are invited to respond to this bid invitation for the CONSTRUCTION OF DN1200 STEEL HIGBURY RISING MAINS & THORNHILL GRAVITY MAIN. The project is located in Mithatha, Eastern Cape.

Only tenderers who are registered with the CIDB (or capable of being so prior to the evaluation of submissions), in a contractor grading designation equal to, or higher, than 8C and who are also able to satisfy the prequalification criteria stated in the tender data, are eligible to tender.

COMPULSORY BID CLARIFICATION MEETING

Tenderers will meet at GIBB (Pty) Ltd office, 36 Stanford Terrace, Mithatha on Wednesday, 25 September 2019 at 10h00 for the compulsory clarification meeting and thereafter proceed to site to a non-compulsory site visit.

Prospective tenderers should read the tender document prior to the meeting and must bring the original tender document to the clarification meeting so that the Proof of Attendance page can be signed. Participants attending the briefing are to be duly authorised to attend the clarification meeting on behalf of the tenderer. No bid documents will be sold at the clarification meeting. Those parties arriving more than 15 minutes after the actual commencement of the briefing will not be allowed to sign the Attendance Register and Returnable Schedule A2. Prospective tenderers that do not attend the compulsory clarification meeting will not be allowed to tender and will be viewed as non-compliant.

BID CONDITIONS

- The 2017 Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 2000 (PPPFA) principles shall apply, whereby submissions will be evaluated accordingly to the provisions of the Act
- Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status will be scored in accordance with the DTI Codes of Good Practice and bidders must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level certificate or a certificate issued by a registered auditor, accounting officer (as contemplated in section 60 (4) of the Closed Corporation Act, 1984) or a accredited verification agency in order to be eligible for B-BBEE points.
- Amatola Water does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender and reserves the right to accept any tender or portion of a tender.
- Tenders which are late, incomplete, unsigned or submitted electronically will not be accepted.
- All tenders are to remain valid for a period of 12 weeks from the closing date of the submission.
- Failure to provide supplementary information specified and completion of the returnable schedules will result in the tender being regarded as non-responsive.
- Tender Forms (Form Cl.1: Form of Offer and Acceptance) that are incomplete or incorrectly completed will result in the disqualification of the tender.
- Only Contractors who have completed at least one project that required the construction of at least 1km of DN800 steel pipe or larger are eligible to tender.
- Only Contractors who have a proposed Site Agent who has at least 5 years' similar experience and with the proposed Main Foreman having supervised at least one project involving the construction of a DN600 or larger steel pipeline are eligible to tender.

PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT POLICY FRAMEWORK ACT NO. 5, 2000 (PPPFA) WILL BE APPLIED AS FOLLOWS:

In terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 2000, Preferential Procurement Regulation 2017, Subcontracting as a Condition of Tender, as specified in Regulation 9 will apply. The successful tenderer will be required to subcontract a minimum of 15% of the contract value to EME's or QSE's that are at least 51% owned by the following: Regulation 9 (f) - Black people living in rural or underdeveloped areas or townships (based in the Mithatha area or, alternatively if no suitable subcontractors are located within the Mithatha area then from within the rural areas of the OR Tambo District Municipality).

LOCAL CONTENT AND PRODUCTION

Contractors submitting tender offers for tender AW2019/20/16 should please note that certain designated local content and production material will be required to be supplied as part of this bid. Contractors are required to comply with the provisions of the National Treasury Instruction Notes relevant to the specific designated commodities.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

The 90/10 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 Pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, (ACT No 5 of 2000) (PPPFA) will be applied to evaluate all bids. The lowest acceptable bid will score 90 points for price and a maximum of 10 points will be awarded depending on the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status Level of Contribution. Bids received will be evaluated in two (2) phases; namely Mandatory Requirements and Price and Preference.

BID PUBLICATION

Bid documents will be available from 10h00 on Monday, 16 September 2019 at Reception at Amatola House, 6 Lancaster Road, Vincent, East London and then during working hours between 08h00 – 16h00 until one week after Compulsory Bid Clarification Meeting. A non-refundable fee of R750.00 is payable for each set of bid documents. Payment is to be made by either bank deposit or Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) only (no cash or cheque payments will be accepted) and to be made payable to Amatola Water, Standard Bank, Account No. 080002277, Branch Code: 050021. The bidder's company name must be used as reference. The proof of deposit is required to collect tender documents. No tender documents will be sold at the briefing meeting.

BID SUBMISSION

The original completed bid documents must be submitted in a sealed envelope or parcel endorsed with the Bid Number and Bid Description as detailed in the Tender Data. The sealed envelope must be deposited in the Bid/Tender Box located in the reception area of Amatola House, 6 Lancaster Rd, Vincent, East London, prior to the time and date indicated in the bid notice and the Tender Data. The bid submissions will be opened in public shortly after the closing time.
